It's hard to believe that around 25 years ago, Gumdale first connected to the internet. Now we are a bring your own device school. Did you know that Google is only 27 years old? I asked my class how old they thought Google was the other day, and their guesses ranged from 100 to 2000 years old.

Teaching has changed so much in that time, but one thing has never changed: the pride and joy we teachers feel in watching our gumnuts grow. Every day we get to see them sprout new ideas, stretch their branches a little further, and sometimes drop nutty surprises along the way.

Gumdale has changed so much in 90 years. Yet through all this change, the heart of teaching here remains the same. We guide each gumnut to grow, to stretch, to discover their strength, and to branch out with courage and innovation.

It's a privilege to nurture the next canopy of Gumdale's mighty gum tree.
